This market will resolve to "No" if any of the following conditions are met by November 30, 2025, 11:59 PM ET:

- Zohran Mamdani loses the New York City Mayoral Election
- US x Venezuela military engages
- Russia x Ukraine ceasefire
- Xi Jinping out
- Nuclear weapon detonates
- Government stays shutdown

Otherwise, this market will resolve to "Yes".

1. Zohran Mamdani loses the New York City Mayoral Election

The 2025 New York City mayoral election will be held on November 4, 2025, to elect the mayor of New York City.

This market will resolve "No" if the candidate who wins the election is not Zohran Mamdani.

The resolution source for this market is the Associated Press, Fox News, and NBC. This market will resolve once all three sources call the race for the same candidate. If all three sources haven't called the race for the same candidate, this market will resolve based on official certification.

2. US x Venezuela military engages

This market will resolve to "No" if there is a military engagement between the military forces of the United States of America and Venezuela during this market's above-specified time frame.

A "military engagement" is defined as any incident involving the use of force such as missile strikes, artillery fire, exchange of gunfire, or other forms of direct military engagement between US and Venezuelan military forces. Non-violent actions, such as warning shots or missile launches that land in territorial waters or pass through airspace, will not qualify for a "No" resolution. Intentional ship ramming that results in significant damage to (e.g., a hole in the hull) or the sinking of a military ship by another will count toward a "No" resolution; however, minor damage (scrapes, dents) will not.

Any U.S. military kinetic strike that impacts Venezuelan land territory will qualify for a "No" resolution.

Missiles or drone strikes which are intercepted will not qualify regardless of whether they land on adversarial territory or cause damage. Similarly, surface-to-air missile strikes impacting adversarial territory will not qualify for a "No" resolution (although surface to air missiles fired at an adversarial military aircraft would qualify).

Note: the U.S. Coast Guard is a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces; Venezuela's Milicia Nacional Bolivariana (militia) is a "special component" of the Venezuelan National Bolivarian Armed Forces (FANB); and Venezuela's Coast Guard (Comando de Guardacostas) is a component of the Venezuelan Navy (Armada Bolivariana) and thus part of the FANB.

The resolution source for this market will be a consensus of credible reporting.

3. Russia x Ukraine ceasefire

This market will resolve to "No" if there is an official ceasefire agreement, defined as a publicly announced and mutually agreed halt in military engagement, between Russia and Ukraine during this market's above-specified time frame.

If the agreement is officially reached before the resolution date, this market will resolve to "No," regardless of whether the ceasefire officially starts afterward.

Any form of informal agreement will not be considered an official ceasefire. Humanitarian pauses will not count toward the resolution of this market.

A peace deal or political framework will qualify if it includes a publicly announced and mutually agreed halt in military engagement, effective on a specific date. Frameworks or agreements that outline terms for a future peace but do not include an explicit, dated commitment to stop fighting will not count.

This market's resolution will be based on official announcements from both Russia and Ukraine; however, a wide consensus of credible media reporting stating an official ceasefire agreement between Russia and Ukraine has been reached will suffice.

4. Xi Jinping out

This market will resolve to "No" if China's General Secretary of the Communist Party, Xi Jinping, is removed from power for any length of time during this market's above-specified time frame.

CCP General Secretary Xi Jinping will be considered removed from power if he announces his resignation from his role as General Secretary, or is otherwise dismissed, detained, disqualified, or otherwise loses his position or is prevented from fulfilling his duties as General Secretary within this market's timeframe.

The primary resolution source for this market will be a consensus of credible reporting.

5. Nuclear weapon detonates

This market will resolve to "No" if a nuclear weapon is detonated anywhere in the world during this market's above-specified time frame.

For the purpose of this market's resolution, any detonation of a nuclear weapon anywhere on the planet Earth or in space will be sufficient to trigger a "No" resolution. This includes offensive usages, nuclear tests, and accidental detonations.

Use/launch of a nuclear weapon that fails to detonate, a fake weapon that never detonates, or a dirty bomb that distributes radioactive material by means of a conventional explosion are not sufficient to trigger a "No" resolution of this market. Only a successful nuclear detonation will result in a "No" resolution.

This market may resolve to "No" as soon as a nuclear detonation is confirmed by a preponderance of credible reporting.

For the purpose of this market's resolution, determination as to whether a detonation was nuclear will be made by a preponderance of credible reporting.

6. Government stays shutdown

This market will resolve to "No" if the U.S. The Office of Personnel Management (OPM) does not announce that the U.S. federal government is not shut down due to a lapse in appropriations during this market's above-specified time frame.

Partial shutdowns count as shutdowns; announcements of office closures due to holidays or inclement weather do not qualify as a shutdown.
